Estacada Creamery Business Growing

Business at the Estacada creamery and cheese factory has increased right along since Manager Doherty first opened the doors to receive milk and cream from the farmers. From a small quantity at first the amount of milk received daily at the factory has grown to more than 2,500 pounds. During June the company paid 30 cents a pound for butter fat, and the company guar-

antees to pay 27½ cents for June. Several hundred pounds of cheese of the full cream grade have been made, and much of this has already been sold.

The farmers have discovered that it is a paying thing for them to sell their milk to the creamery, and that by so doing work on the farm is greatly lessened.
