HERE is undoubtedly a belief on the part of some that a long tenure in judicial office is against the true theory of popular government, and there is in consequence a clamor that the judicial term of office shall be reduced TO A BRIEF PERIOD. I once had occasion as circuit judge to decide a matter involving the prohibition laws of Kansas and decided it against the convictions of the radical advocates of prohibition, whereupon the leaders met in convention and passed a resolution demanding that federal judges should be appointed or elected FOR ONLY ONE YEAR. The judges of the federal courts as well as of the courts of two or three states are appointed for life, which intensifies the clamor against
