Portland people with plenty capital were out here last week looking over the Garfield country. They want to buy 200 acres in that locality to grow apples on. The J. P. Irvin and other farms were inspected, and, we are informed, that a transfer will soon take place. The people who want the land are going into apple culture the same as it is carried on at Hood River. They are satisfied with the kind of soil, and believe the climate is as favorable here as it is at Hood River. It begins to look as though the Garfield country will become famous as an apple country. Why not?

A Good Year For Peaches

Chas. Still was in town Tuesday with a load of Crawford peaches grown on his farm a few miles down the Clackamas river from Estacada. Mr. Still says this is a good year for peaches; the crop is heavy and of good quality. He has 100 year old trees that are also coming into bearing. His farm is down on the low river flat where the soil is sandy and especially adapted to peach raising. Mr. Still finds a bigger market for his fruit than he can supply. A. J. Brown, whose farm is a mile up the river from Mr. Still's, also has a good crop of peaches this year.

Wm. Beeson

The funeral of Wm. Beeson, who died at Estacada Thursday, Aug. 23, was held Friday at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Mayfield, and the interment was in Highland cemetery. Mr. Beeson was 75 years old. He was born in Wayne Co., Indiana, and with his wife moved to Oregon in March '63, crossing the plains with ox teams arriving in October in Clackamas county. There are five children in the family, four of whom, with the mother, survive. The children are: James Beeson of Shubel, Mrs. Mary Harbrook of Camas, Wash., Mrs. Sarah Inel of Elkton, Mrs. Clara Mayfield of Estacada. He leaves 16 grandchildren, and three great-grandchildren.—Oregonian.
