**Valuable Clay
Beds Found**

What is believed to be a valuable clay deposit has been found by J. S. Osborne while digging a well on his place bordering town. When down 12 feet a dark, heavy clay was run into which could not be dug with pick and shovel, but had to be blown out. Chunks of the clay can be cut with a knife similar to a potato. Pieces of it burned in a stove came out whole, smooth and of a beautiful color, and hard as flint. It is the belief of all that this clay is perfect for fire brick or pottery. Mr. Osborne has dug through 30 feet of it, and it is believed to exist here in a limitless quantity.
