Court Decides In Favor of Bank

Judge Gantenbein of the state circuit court, issued an order Monday, 16th, directing T. C. Devlin as receiver of the Cregon Trust & Savings Bank, to deliver to the Estacada State Bank two certificates of deposit aggregating \$41,256 on condition that the Pacific & Eastern Ry. Co. will cancel the claim it holds against the Oregon Trust & Saving Bank for the deposit of \$40,423.31 and will make a cash payment of \$827.69 to the Portland bank.

This was done to save the Estacada State Bank from being forced into insolvency.

According to the statement of the Estacada State Bank, in petition of Louis J. Wilde against the Oregon Trust & Savings Bank, filed yesterday, the 2 certificates of deposit in the Oregon Trust & Savings Bank for \$20,625 each, were issued May 20, 1907, by the Estacada institution upon the request of the Pacific deliver them in Estacada at & Eastern Ry. Co. and of the defunct Portland bank. The return consideration which was to be given the Estacada bank and the understanding among the three parties w. s that the certificates were to be sold on a commission basis by Mr. E. L.

The Pacific & Eastern Ry. Co. was organized to construct a railroad from Joe Bar, Jackson county, to a point near Crater Lake. It had on deposit with the Oregon Trust bank at the time of the bank's failure \$40,422.31 If the Estacada bank had been compelled to meet the certificates, which could not legally have been done, it would have been forced into insolvency, according to the petitioners, so that the terms and in amounts to suit borinstitution would not only have egon City Banks taken in exchange been unable to pay in full for the for first lien real estate mortgages. certificates, but could not have paid its depositors. The petition shows that the railway company is willing to fulfill its part of the agreement by turning over its deposit in the defunct Portland bank and making a cash payment to balance the am'. of the claim held against the Estacada bank.

By complying with Judge Gantenbein's order, Receiver Devlin will be r lieved of a debt of more than \$40,000 due the railway company, and the Estacada bank will be ena-
