The county court yesterday fixed the county tax levy at 17 mills.

The Cazadero Salmon hatchery is proving great success. There are 850,000 young fry that are nearly ready to be turned out.

Attorney C. Schuebel of Oregon City gets the U. S. District Attorney's office which he has been trying for some time to get. We believe he will make good in it.

State Senator J. Eugene Hedges of Oregon City, was in Estacada last Saturday on legal business. He is a candidate to succeed himself in the senate. This was his first visit here since last summer.

A petition is being circulated by F. M. Gill which favors a law prohibiting the legislature from repealing a law which has been created by the people on the initiative and referendum. This privilege should rest in the people themselves who are responsible for the law.

A Poultry Experiment

Dr. W. Wallens, of Springfield, sends in a report of his last year's work with his Rose Comb Rhode Island Red chickens. The report shows something what can be done with a few hens well kept. The doctor says—

Jan. 1, 1907, I had 9 roosters and cockerels and 18 hens and pullets, total, 27. On Jan. 1, 1908, I had 8 roosters and cockerels and 30 hens and pullets, total, 38. Cost of feed including wheat, oats, chop, poultry food, oyster shells and ground bone \$21.45. Returns of all kinds including selling of eggs and young roosters and two pullets, \$50.15. Value of the increase, \$10. total, \$60.15. Total returns added to which is the value of the increase of stock amounts to \$60.15. Total cost of keep, \$21.05. Profit, \$39.10. Profit per chicken of all kinds divided by 27, the number starting with, shows a profit of \$1.45 a bird. I would have done better had roop not taken over 1/3 of the flock.
