**TO SUBSCRIBERS**  
 A new postal law was passed by the last congress establishing a new order governing the mailing of Second Class Mail Matter. Under this order subscriptions to weekly newspapers must not be declining longer than one year to entitle the paper to be mailed at second class matter rates. The publisher must pay an advanced rate of postage on all newspapers sent out on which the subscription is not paid for more than a year. This will make it practically prohibitive for the publisher to send out papers to subscribers who are delinquent unless the subscriber pays the postage and that will make subscriptions much higher. We wish readers of THE NEWS to take notice of this and consider it. If your subscription to the paper has expired do not delay with your renewal.

This is campaign year for political offices. The work is already well along, both in county and national affairs. The candidates for county offices are nearly all confined to those who are present incumbents of the county court house. Aspirants for public positions may not be as numerous this year as they were two years ago, although it is hard to foretell what deals will yet be put up to accomplish some favored object. The same old questions will again be discussed, and fought out on the same lines.

W. M. Averell is in Estacada soliciting subscriptions to "Western Life" a magazine of the West and for the West. There is a little exploitation proposition connected with this. For a certain number of subscriptions the proprietors of the magazine will contribute a few pages of the book to an illustrated and descriptive write-up of the town. The magazine is read by several thousand readers, and the benefit to be derived from a write-up in it is plain to anyone. Mr. Averell should get the full number of subscriptions.

It is announced that Mr. F. M. Gill is a candidate for state representative from Clackamas county, and that he will make his personal statement to that effect within a couple weeks. He will be a candidate as a republican, though his tendencies to independency in matters political are quite well known. Should Mr. Gill enter the race for representative we predict his nomination and election by good majorities. He is well known throughout most of the county, and is a man highly qualified for the office. Why not give Eastern Clackamas this one representative?

**A Public Library**  
 Estacada may have a public library, or rather, a public reading room. The room previously occupied as an office by Dr. Haviland has been offered for that purpose by E. F. Surface. A short time ago the Epworth League made an effort to start a public reading room, but too many obstacles seemed to be in the way, and the work was abandoned. If the League committee will confer with Mr. Surface satisfactory arrangements may be arrived at. No charge will be made for rent, and it is probable the railway company will furnish lights free. A partition will have to be removed, and the room furnished with chairs, desks, tables, shelves and a stove.  
 LATER—The room referred to above has been rented for a barber shop, but an addition will be built to the drug store in which there will be a room for the reading room.
