William Stubbe, one of the old residents of this country, was committed to the insane asylum at Salem last Friday afternoon after an examination by Dr. Strickland of Oregon City before County Judge G. B. Dimick. The news came as a surprise to the people here and at his home. Mr. Stubbe left home apparently in usual health. He is 61 years old, and has lived with his family off the farm near Estacada for years. He spent much of the time soliciting subscriptions to different publications. It is thought that troubles worried him to such an extent that his mind became affected, and realizing his mental condition he sought a medical examination for his own benefit with the result that he was sent to the state asylum.
