### RESIDENCE BURNS

House and All Its Contents Go Up in Fiery Flames

Another fire, and another home gone. The Eckerson residence at the corner of Shafford and Fourth streets burned to the ground Friday night. Mr. and Mrs. W. H. Close who occupied the house were away, on a trip to St. Martin's Springs, and no one was in the house at the time. John Pegg, who lives across the street, was the first to see the fire at about 3 o'clock Saturday morning. He gave the alarm, and in a few minutes nearly the whole town was out, but nothing under heavens could save anything. The nearest water hydrant is 600 feet away, and the fire company's hose reached but half way to the fire. Mr. Close carried \$1,200 on all his household effects which were valued at \$2,600. The house was small, but one of the best built in the town. The origin of the fire is a mystery, but it is thought that it was started by burglars. The house was valued at about \$500.
