Blown Up by Dynamite

Nels Booden, a farmer residing a mile north of Boring killed himself at 4 o'clock Monday afternoon by exploding dynamite.

Booden was about 45 years old, and was very much of a recluse. He was a widower and lived with his daughter, with whom he has recently had some serious trouble, and on last Saturday the daughter went to Oregon City to see a lawyer with a view of having the home property divided, and leaving her father.

Monday afternoon the young lady heard a terrific explosion out near the barn, and believing that her father had killed himself, she ran to a neighbor's, about a half mile distant, and upon their return to the place found that her suspicions were true. He had blown himself up with dynamite out behind his own barn.

Booden moved into the neighborhood three years ago. He was an eccentric, and it is understood that he often threatened to take his own life.
