A New Mill For Estacada

The Western Lumber & Fuel Co. started up its saw mill again last week and is cutting out mill timbers for the purpose of erecting a saw mill plant at their factory in Estacada, where they intend to move their saw mill immediately and will then operate the saw mill and factory permanently.

They expect to have the saw mill and factory working on full time with a full crew of men by the first of the year, and the Company also intends to continue cutting wood for the Portland Markets permanently. It is the intention of this Company to give permanent employment to about fifty men at their Estacada saw mill and factory, and in the forest, as soon as they can put all of their enterprises in operation which will be in about three months.

\$500,000 Electric Plant For Estacada

It will be remembered that among the first issues of the Progress, notice was given of a real estate deal made through the Estacada State Bank whereby, John Zobrist disposed of all the river frontage on his property, unsold. This property has been acquired by the Clackamas Land & Electric Power Co., a corporation capitalized at \$500,000. J. W. Reed put a force of men to work building roads and tearing down the old Bowen camp and moving the same down to the bank of the Clackamas, for the purpose of making a camp for the construction of a big concrete dam, to be built on this property. This enterprise will be pushed rapidly, it is said, to completion. It is understood that the Morris Bros. are named among the promoters of the big enterprise.

The incorporators are Wirt Miner, H. B. Crossman and C. K. Williams. Portland is given as the principal place of business. The corporation proposes to engage a varied and comprehensive line of enterprises, as shown by its articles. It intends to build and maintain dams, reservoirs, canals, ditches, aqueducts, flumes, pipe and pipe lines for storing and conducting the waters of the lakes and running streams of Oregon; to build and maintain flour mills, grist mills, saw mills, wooden mills, paper mills pulp mills, and mills for the manufacture of lumber and wooden ware iron, steel and their products, and all other minerals and mineral products, and all kinds of implements, tools and machinery, made of wood or metal; also factories, packing houses and plants of all kinds and to equip and operate them and to buy and sell articles for manufacture therein and the manufactured products thereof; to appropriate and divert particularly the waters of Clackamas River and tributaries for developing mineral resources and for generating and furnishing electrical power; to build and maintain stations, buildings, poles, pole lines, wire lines, conduits and all other structures adapted to the generation, transmission, conversion, application and use of electric power; to fix and collect tolls, rates and charges for the use of its properties and enterprises.
