FINCH KILLS FISHER.

Oregon Bar Prosecutor Shot by Disbarred Lawyer.

Portland, Nov. 30.-Attorney Ralph B. Fisher, prosecutor for the grievand committee of the Oregon State Bar association, was shot and killed almost instantly at 1:30 o'clock Saturday afternoon by Attorney J. A. Finch, who had been recently disbarred as the result of charges of drunkenness that were prosecuted by Mr. Fisher.

The tragedy occurred in Mr. Fisher's private office, 322 Mohawk building, Third and Morrison streets. Verna Burkhart, Mr. Fisher's stenographer, was the only witness, and she and industrial opportunity for all na-fled screaming from the room.
