It has been suggested that at the forth coming election the citizen voters would like to know what the candidates to be elected stand for. Also as individuals and prospective candidates are being misrepresented on the license question would it not be a wise thing to have placed on the city ballot "For License" "Against License" and let an expression of the people settle this question so far as our law making and enforcing body goes. We understand that from a legal standpoint, from the ruling of the courts such a vote will only settle the question as to the wishes of the voters. Should the people vote it "dry" or "wet" we believe no council that did not recognize the expressed desire of the voters could have standing before the people.

Though the commercial bodies of the Coast were disappointed that the Chicago school children did not accept the invitation tendered them through the Chicago Association of Commerce, the invitation has born fruit, and from June 2nd to June 17th a large party of Chicago business men will come to the Pacific North-west under the auspices of the Association, including various Oregon points in their itinerary.

The State Editorial Association which convened at the Commercial Club's rooms, Portland, on Friday and Saturday of last week was not as well attended as it should have been, however those present outlined work of importance to the craft and if a united effort is made along these lines good will result. Baker City was the place decided upon for the next annual meeting. It is expected to arrange a trip to the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific exposition sometime in July.
