Day, now serving time in the pen for gratifying a desire to do a foolish thing, certainly has paid too much for it to feel that he has gained a victory, and in the same sense we believe that Mayor Hevlman, in attempting to hold the books against the order of the court to the very limit of time, verged very close on the foolish. thing to do.






