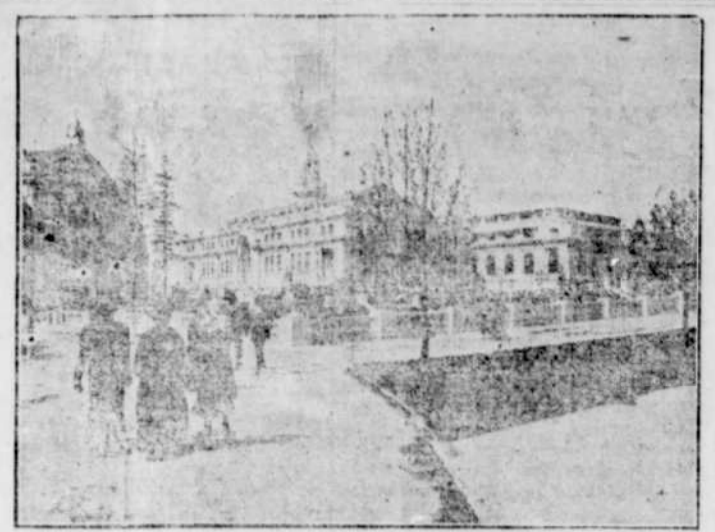

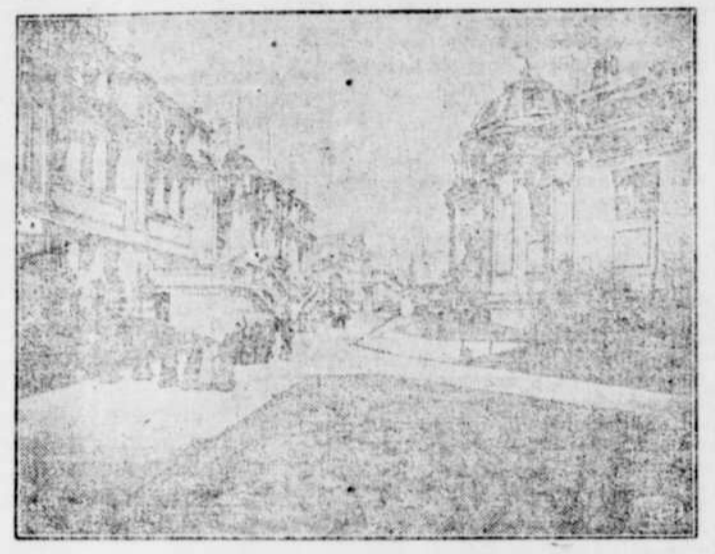

SCENE ON THE COURT OF HONOR, A.-Y.-P. EXPOSITION, SEATTLE.

In constructing its group of five buildings, the United States Government had regard for the type of architecture followed generally in the buildings of the Exposition proper. The Exposition structures are in the modern French renaissance and the Government in the modern Spanish. The two styles blend nicely together and make an harmonious whole. On the right of the picture is the Alaska building, one of the Government group. In the center is the European Exhibits Palace. On the left is a facade of the Palace of Agriculture. The last two named are in the French renaissance and were completed before December 1, 1908. The Alaska building was completed April 15.



A SUNNY DAY ON YUKON AVENUE, A.-Y.-P. EXPOSITION, SEATTLE.

Yukon Avenue is one of the many ways leading to the Court of Honor of the Alaska-Yukon-Pacific Exposition. It leads from the Cascades down to one of the many entrances to the Pay Streak and directly to the "caf6 center" of the Fair Grounds.

On the left of the picture a facade of the European Exhibits Building shows. On the right is a corner of the Palace of Agriculture. In the distance, and across the Cascades, is to be seen the Oriental Building.

All of these structures were completed before December 1, 1908. They are of the conventional exposition type of construction—plaster staff over heavy wooden framework.

Geese and swan—Except in Harney, Baker, Union, Wallowa, Sherman, Gilliam, Grant, Klamath, Malheur and Lake, open season extends October 1 to March 1. In the counties named it extends from September 1 to May 1.

Honker Geese—In Grant, Harney, and Malheur, the open season extends from September 1 to March 1. In all other counties it extends from September 1 to May 1.

Shore and wading birds—Open season extends from October 1 to April 1.
