

FARM CENSUS ECONOMY.

Director Durand Hopes to Save Sev eral Hundred Thousand Dollars. Washington, Oct. 11.—U. S. Census Directr Dana E. Durand hopes to save

everal hundred thousand dollars in taking the census of agriculture and also to increase the accuracy of the statistics. The director stated today that at' the

census of 1900 the agricultural data were handled by means of punched cadrs. Director Durand said the statistics f population and of agriculture are

collected by a different force from that employed in gathering the statistics of manuafctures. The population and agricultural data are secured by enum-erators of whom there will be about 65,000 at the present census, they in turn being appointed by the supervis-ors, of whom there are about 330. The Key West guards took charge of the difficulty of securing competent and faithful enumerators is very great. The length of service is very short, 15 days in the cities and 30 days in the country districts. The pay is small, averaging perhaps three dollars per day in the country districts and a trifle more in the cities, practically the pay talk so much of ordniary mechanics. 
