Portland Railway Buys More Power

Included In The Sale Are The Entire Holdings Of The Portland Water Power & Electric Transmission Co., The River Mill Co. And The Brick Plant

The Portland Railway, Light & Power Co. by their purchase last Thursday now own three important water power sites on the Clackamas which, when the contemplated improvements have been completed, will make them the system in the United States.

prises The Portland Railway, Light & Power Co. have already sent an engineer to the site to secure the geographical data necessary to locate the exact site to be used, as two are under consideration, when this is done core drills will be set to work to determine the nature of the rock underneath and a number of test holes will be dug, the same as has been done at the upper Cazadero dam. A hollow concrete dam is likely to be built, but if this type is decided upon the power house will not be located under the OFFICE BEHIND ESTACADA STATE BANK dam, as stated by a Portland paper. There is no need of any such thing as there are good sites for the power plant without doing that. The power plant will be located close to the dam and there will be no necessity of a flume or canal, as had been decided by the former company.
