

STATISTICS IN GRAIN YIELD.

Wheat Crops of Enormous Size.

Washington, Dec. 21.—The department of agriculture today made public its statistics of the winter and spring wheat crop of various states for the past year. This report shows that 11, 235,000 bushels of winter wheat were produced in Oregon, an average of 21 bushels to the acre. The total farm value of the crop of December 1 was \$10,449,000, or 93 cents per bushel. The spring wheat crop of Oregon is given at 5,142,000 bushels, or 18.7 bushels to the acre. 
