The death of King Edward came as a great surprise to his own people as well as others. It had only gotten into the papers that he was seriously ill when his death was announced. His reign has been short but his people were agreeably disappointed in it. The long reign of his mother endeared to all by her noble lite and the seeming difference that should occur when the then Prince of Wales should become king as predicted by most observers was not favorable to the new king. In this they have been disappointed, for the new king, Edward the 7th, soon enhas been peaceful and good. The body of King Edward will rest at Windsor in the mausoleum. George the fifth second son of King Edward, has been proclaimed king.

Beginning May 16th, there will be a series of good roads meetings throughout the state that will continue until June 10. Mr. Maurice W. He confirmed his purchase of the Oregon Electric and United Railways, interurban systems running out of Portland, and says he will extend them down the Willamette Valley. He also confirmed his purchase of the Pacific & Eastern but said it was yet too early to talk of a connecting road clear across the state. The Deschutes road will of course go ahead as fast as possible, he said, and besides all this railroad activity in this state, Mr. Hill proposes to do a great deal in securing publicity for Oregon throughout the East and Middle West.

The visit of James J. Hill and party to Portland during the past week has been of great significance. Accompanied by railroad officials, Louis W. Hill has left Portland to make a tour of the state. He will ecross Central Oregon and see for himself what the tonnage possibilities of that great region are. After this trip, it is expected that a definite announcement will be made as to the expected east and west lines across the state.

# Body Of John

Fisherman From Parkplace Catch Body In Net-Jury

> Drawn And Listen To Evidence

About daybreak on Sunday last two fisherman from Parkplace, J. C. Purce and Henry Himmler, who had come up the Clackamas to fish, while raising their nets found they had become tangled about some object that required an extra effort to raise, suddenly the head of a man bobbed up almost in the face of the fishermen. The heavy lead line had become fastened to part of the clothing and as the body was 'partially buried in the sand it would probably have remained imbeded there except for the accidental entangling of the fish net to the body.

The point on the river where the body was found is at Lewy Barren's eddy, about two miles from Estacada. The fishermen tied the body with a rope and made it fast to the shore and then went up to J. T. Doty's and telephoned to Coroner Holman at Oregon City, who replied that he would be there as soon as possible. Word had also been 'phoned to Estacada of the finding of the body and it was at once supposed to be that of John Bates. All day long persons desiring to satisfy themselves that it was Bates made their way over the rough trail to the point where the body lay in the water.
