Actual Time in Flight 2 Hours 32

New York, May 31 .- Glenn H. Curtiss flew from Albany to New York City in an aeroplane, Sunday, May 29, winning the \$10,000 prize offered by the New York World.

He covered the distance of 137 miles in 2 hours and 32 minutes, and came to earth as quietly and as lightly as a pigeon. His average speed for the distance—54.06 miles per hour—surpasses any other record made by an aeroplance in long-distance flight. In its entirety, his flight perhaps eclipses any flight man has made in heavierthan-air machines.
