The good accomplished by the display of strawberries at the first effort of the Commercial Club to advertise the kind we can produce, the future alone can reveal. Most of our small fruit raisers were in evidence with berries, but while this was true it was seen that not as much enthusiasm was instilled into the exhibition as should be. We are not finding fault, but merely note our observance of conditions as we saw them. Our exhibition of berries was very creditable and some were enthusiastic, but not all. We believe the time will come in the growing of small fruits in Eastern Clackamas when keen competition to excel will be the ruling motive. Our display was very good, and especially so when it is observed that scarcely any effort was made at making use of display art to show off what the fruit was, scarcely any effort at all was made along this line. It was a beginning however and we predict that the future will bring out of Eastern Clackamas not only choice fruit but keen competition in fruit as well as in the art of displaying it.

The Rose Show in Portland has become a fixed carnival in the life of that city with a world-wide reputation. The city can scarcely accommodate the vast throngs of people that annually gather to enjoy the week's festivities. It's citizens vie with each other each succeeding year in their efforts at display, which has led to the expenditure of large sums of money.

At noon Monday the carnival was opened and for one whole week it's citizens are putting forth the greatest effort they have ever made to entertain and display to the world the carnival spirit of Portland. Thousands of people are going to see and hundreds of thousands more are reading about them and taking notice of their big week's carnival.

New through Northern Pacific service between Portland and Chicago has been established via the North Bank road, the new train having a running time of 72 hours, the same as the North Coast Limited. A readjustment of the time schedules on the Northern Pacific line between Portland and Seattle, allowing for the joint use of a part of the track by the Oregon & Washington, the new Harriman line, will be made within a few days.

An Oregon shingle mill in Tillamook City worked 33 days on one mammoth cedar log, cutting from it 147,000 shingles. This is almost unbelievable to people not familiar with the Pacific Coast, where big trees and vast timber resources are accepted quite as a matter of course.


