We are very sorry to see the dismantling of the wood working plant and sawmill that is now going on in Estacada. These have been the means of distributing a good deal of money and giving employment to the working people living here. The wood plant has had a varied career under many different managements. After this plant was so well equipped with machinery, dry kiln and the facilities for producing much that we need in our buildings, to stand by and observe that its owners deem it necessary to tear it down and ship it elsewhere, is what we are sorry to know. The building up of a city depends largely on the ability of its laboring men to find employment. The successful manufacturing plant is what we need. We are sorry to admit of having failures and unprofitable manufacturing plants.

An annual apple snow that will reach big proportions has been determined on for Portland. The first such exhibit will be held in November and it is expected to have the entire state represented in a way never before attempted. The Commercial Club, business men and hotel men's association have all entered heartily into the project at the instance of the Oregon State Horticultural Society, which proposes to celebrate its quarter centennial this Fall by inaugurating a big annual apple fair that is expected to grow with each passing year until it attains proportions ullyous where it will attract national in-

Willamette Valley dairymen are to have the chance of listening to one of the greatest experts in dairying in the world, when Professor Bernhard Boeggild of the Royal Danish Agricultural College at Copenhagen arrives here July 18. Oregon City, Corvallis, Salem, Albany, Forest Grove and McMinnville will be visited and the Commercial Clubs will entertain the visiting expert. He is studying American dairy conditions and he will no doubt give many hints in his talks that will be of great value to the industry in Oregon.

Gray's Harbor people are talking over the project of building a caual from that waterway through Willapa Harbor to the Columbia River, thus giving a deep water, dependable channel to the sea. One meeting has already been held and the people are considering it seriously. It is said such a project will cost not over \$1,000,000 and in addition to its aid to navigation, will drain a territory covering 10,000 acres of marsh land, now practically worthless.

The Willamette Valley Chautauqua Assembly is now holding their 17th annual assembly at Gladstone Park, It commenced July 12th and ends on the 24th. The association has a very intersting program at the school house on Douglas this season. Many of the speakers to be heard have world wide reputations. 
