

station, in Ellis county, enough has been accomplished, in the ten seasons since that station was established, to demonstrate that in the semi-arid West good farming pays as well or even better than it does in the rich farming states of the Mississippi valtland, Or ley. Emmer has proved to be especially hardy and drouth-resistant, and in the Northwestern states this grain has given greater yields per acre than barley or oats. However, at the Fort Hays station, in Western Kansas, emer has not proved as hardy and productive as barley and oats. As a feed emmer will hardly take the place of parley and oats, but it may be ground and fed in combination with these grains or with corn. 
