Greater progress has been made by the business interests of Oregon between March 29 and June 30 than in any two-months period in the history of the state since the establishment of the state bank examiner's office. This is disclosed in the report of the Bank Examiner, just

made, covering that period. Deposits in the banks of the state at close of business June 30 totaled \$115,196,986, a gain since March 29 of \$1,192,705. Of these deposits \$11,925.734 were savings deposits, which increased during the same period \$842,985. Total resources of Oregon banks, \$142,418,734. Eight new banks were established in the state during the period covered by the report.

Secretary Wilson of the Department of Agriculture has been in Oregon during the past week seeking information in regard to the settlement of lands included in the forest reserves of the state, He plans to have the reserves remapped and the boundaries established in an accurate way. It is said much land is included in the reserves that should not be, and when the new maps are completed 5,000,000 or 6,000,000 acres now in reserves in this state will be opened up for settlement.

Oregon's two infantry regiments and ambulance company of the National Guard will go into camp at American Lake this month and participate in the usual -joint field maneuvers with the regular army. August 8 is fixed as the date of departure, and the men will remain in camp ten days. Adjutant General Finzer has issued orders for the mobilization of his troops.

Secretary Ballinger of the Depart ment of the Interior is busy on a trip of inspection of the reclamation projects of the state and is becoming familiar with the workings of the service in Oregon, Among other things, he will start preliminary surveys of Crater Lake National Park, looking toward its development along the lines of the better known national parks of the




