Members of the Board of Army Engineers have inspected the Umatilla irrigation project during the past week and upon their report depends Oregon's chances of sharing in the \$20,000,000 bond issue proposed for the completion of reclamation projects already under way.

They went carefully over the district and saw thriving orchards, alfalfa fields from which three crops have been cut, and gardens filled with fine vegetables.
