School For Deaf Opens Sept. 28th

The fall session of the new State School for the Deaf will open Sept. 28th. The new buildings, for which the last legislature appropriated seventy-five thousand dollars, have been completed and are being made ready for occupancy. Those formerly occupied have been transferred to the State Sanitarium for the Treatment of Tuberculosis.

Through ignorance of the existence of the school, or misconception of its purpose and character, there are deaf children in many communities who are not sent to school at all, or are not sent at the proper time. Thus these children are compelled to lose many years of valuable time, and others are actually allowed to grow up to manhood and womanhood, ignorant helpless, dependent, unable to express their simplest wants in verbal language, cut off from social converse, mentally and spiritually starved and stunted. Their very unnecessary plight is infinitely worse than that of the wholly illiterate hearing person, and surely no missionary, or social, or civic duty was ever more sacred than that of seeing that there are as few such cases as possible. Especially so, as the state provides FREE every facility for the prevention of such disastrous results. Full information regarding the school can be had by addressing the Superintendent State School for Deaf, Salem, Oregon.

Preaches Last Sermon In Conference Year

Rev. H. W. Kuhlman is attending Annual Conference at Hillsboro this week. Before his sermon last Sunday evening, he mentioned among items of interest to the church, the number of accessions by letter or certificate, the subscription on the charge of over \$50 for Anti-Saloon League work, the raising of over \$100 during the year by the Ladies' Aid Society, the marriage ceremonies of 13 couples, and the expenditure of over \$1400 on the charge for current expenses, besides the raising of \$1000 for the new church on the charge. The missionary and benevolent collection and subscriptions on the charge amounted to \$55. The pastor's salary at each point was readily and generously provided for. At the last quarterly conference a unanimous call was given for the return of the pastor for another year.

Mr. Kuhlman desires to thank all who have aided in the generous support of the church work.
