Another Serious Fire Last Saturday

Home of John Tracy Burns to the Ground on Saturday Afternoon

That misfortune and unlooked for trouble seldom come singly has been again verified in our city. The citizens had not recovered from the shock of the burning of the cigar factory, Howe's wareroom and Hunt's hall, which was a serious loss to so small a city as Estacada, when fire again was the agent in destroying one of our best built homes.

About 3 o'clock on Saturday afternoon smoke was seen by Mrs. John Tracy issuing from her home which is located just outside the city limits. The alarm was given and firemen and neighbors quickly responded, but in less time than we can tell about it was in ruins. No fire was in the house at the time the building caught. Mrs. Tracy had just gone to the garden and Mr. Tracy, about an hour before, had gone down town. Mr. Tracy thinks a woodrat the cause of the fire.

He estimates the entire loss at \$3,000. The property was insured in the Oregon Fire Relief Association of McMinnville for \$800. A pathetic part of the loss is the many little trinkets, remembrances of the children and other associations accumulated during their long married life, which no money can replace. Mr. Tracy will at once rebuild.
