Employers' Liability Law

Portland commercial organizations, namely the Chamber of Commerce, the Employers Association, the Manufacturers Association and the United Metal Trades Association, have issued the following statement and recommendation in regard to the passing of the Employers' Liability law at the coming election:

There seems to be much interest shown in the Employers liability bills of this state which are to be on the ballot and voted for on election day.

Organized labor seems to be very anxious to have bill No. 330 passed and are using every means in their hands to carry through this measure. We believe also the employers are interested in bill number 346, but it occurs that both parties are in much haste to adjust this great question.

New York has passed a law which went into effect Sept. 10. This is entitled the Workmen's Compensation Law, it applies to workmen engaged in manual or mechanical labor in certain vocations whereby the workingman if he meets with an accident is positive of receiving a weekly remuneration or if he meets with death, his family receives a certain amount from the employer. New York state has also passed another law whereby it is optional with the employer or employee, which went into effect Sept. 1st.

Wisconsin has a commission with a report from same to be passed on at the next assembling of legislature.

Minnesota has a new law which has been suggested by a commission and it would seem that this is a question so great that there should not be great haste in deciding it by the initiative.

Should we make a mistake and get something on the statute books which is not right, it would be next to impossible to erase same.

It occurs to us that this question should be carefully and duly considered either by a commission or by a chosen committee of legislature, and we should co-operate with the other Pacific Coast states and possibly our other adjoining states, on a measure of this kind, because if we pass a too drastic measure it would affect our business interests and possibly deter many small concerns or new industries from starting within our borders. It would not only affect the employing interests but the laboring man as well.

In consulting with many of our leading business men we find that there seems to be an inclination to leave this matter to a commission of men chosen from all walks in life and then we are sure of impartiality and fairness, to all. This would require a vote on No. 346.

Supreme Court Should Be Taken Out Of Politics

Judge Will R. King, who is a candidate for re-election to the Supreme Court of Oregon, has made an enviable record on the supreme bench, where he has been for four years. He has been the author of the opinions on many noteworthy cases, some of them so complex that many weeks were required to examine the law and evidence and write the decision. His opinion on Hough vs. Porter, for example, is accepted all over the west as authority on irrigation law and is used as a textbook in the Ann Arbor Law School. His decision in Straw vs. Harris, upheld and clarified the initiative and referendum system. In spite of the thoroughness of his work on each individual opinion, Judge King's total product has been as great as that of any supreme judge in many years.

The Non-Political Judiciary movement, which was started by the State Bar Association in July, has as its object the removal of the supreme court beyond the reach of political influences. The Non-Political Judiciary movement endorses Judge King, so a vote for him is a vote to take the supreme court out of politics and free it from all party obligations.

George H. Burnett, who is seeking Justice King's place on the bench is the nominee of the Republican Assembly and before his selection declared he would not be a candidate unless he received the nomination of the Republican Assembly. He is accordingly on record as in favor of having politics govern the supreme court election.

There is no good reason why a good judge should be put off the bench on account of politics and another judge put in his place on account of politics. Justices Slater, Moore and McBride also have the endorsement of the Non-Political Judiciary movement.

Democrats Hold Meeting

On Monday evening in the I. O. O. F. Hall a democratic meeting was held, which was presided over by Wm. Dale, the local chairman. Ernest T. Mass, of Willamette, candidate for sheriff, was the first speaker. He pledged himself to give a business and non partisan administration, if the people in their judgement believed him to be the best qualified to do the work of a sheriff.

Charles L. Thompson, for county commissioner, made a brief address, after which R. B. Beatie, candidate for sheriff during the past four years, told the people how he believed he could be a good judge for Clackamas Co. To serve the people in that capacity is his ambition.

O. D. Eby, for state senator, followed and in a spirit of thankfulness said to the democrats he very much appreciated their nominating him for the highest office they could give him as a purely state officer. He solicited the votes of the people not from a political issue but as a representative of a principle involving the peoples choice of rule.

R. G. Smith, of Grants Pass, candidate for Congress from this district, was then introduced and made the principal speech of the evening. What he said was well received by his hearers.

The meeting was not large nor so very enthusiastic and was for the most part confined to giving the personal fitness as viewed by the candidates themselves to hold the positions sought. The speakers all paid compliments to their opponents on the ticket. The speeches also were free from the usual mud-slinging done in most campaigns.
