

All through her life an advocate and laborer for the cause of peace, it is not Surprising that Baroness Bertha von Suttner, known throughout

This devoted Austrian lady was born 67 years ago at Prague, daughter of the late Field Marshal Count Frans von Kinsky, a member of one of the most ancient and famous houses of Austria. One would hardly expect an apostle of peace to arise from the warlike house of Kinsky, or that a member of that aristocratic family would been useful in her work. The numerous books she has written show a great knowledge of life in all its

For many years she mourned her lover and she was no longer young when she met and married Baron Gundacar von Suttner. 



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
