



Census Bureau Announces Grand To tal for United States.

Washington - Total population of the United States, exclusive of possessions, approximately 91,549,500. Totals for these states were announced; Wyoming, 14,5965, an increase of 53,434 since 1900.

Alaska, 64,356, an increase of 764. Hawaii, 191,909, an increase of 37,980.

The states so far given have an aggregate population of 85,362,725. This is an increase of 20.4 per cent over the aggregate population contained by the same states in 1900.

The five states ton reported had a aggregate population of 5,139,336 in 1900. If they maintain the growth of other states their aggregate will be brought up to 6,186,774, giving a grand total in the United States of 91,549,503. Even if there should be no gain at all the total would be 90,-502,061.


