

The Oregon Development League and Portland Con mercial Club have taken joint action to secure a re-apportionment, so that this state may secure its just share to continue reclamation work

Portland Commercial bodies are urging the building of a road through the forest reserve surrounding Mt, Hood The Oregon delegation in Congress will be asked to use their influence to secure an appropriation of \$150,000 for the purpose, The building of this road is planned to take the place of the national park originally sought for the slopes of Mount Hood.
