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The correct way to pronounce it is Es-ta-ca-da, accent on the third syllable, a having the sound of a as in ah in the two last syllables.

Unfortunately a mistaken impression, due to lack of information concerning the highway measures has gained place in the minds of some of Oregon's people. The Highway bills of the Oregon Good Roads Association were not framed for the construction of state roads. They put the entire power of road building into the hands of the people of each county. If all the measures were made law and became operative no county would be under greater obligation to build roads than now. Nor is an excessive road tax contemplated. People in the cities, when they want to hard surface streets issue bonds providing a sinking fund and pay for the street out of the increased business and property values.

That Oregon will double its present population during the next ten years is the prediction of Dr. Joseph Schafer, head of the Department of History at the University of Oregon. He draws interesting parallels between the agricultural states of the Middle West and Oregon, which he says is now facing an era similar to that marking the periods of heaviest settlement in the Mississippi Valley. He finds that Illinois, Iowa, Indiana and others doubled their population in ten-year periods when people sought the cheap agricultural lands to be had there. He expects history to repeat itself in Oregon.

It does not seem the right thing to do to break the provisions of a contract made with the stove factory people at Salem, that they have the services of the convict labor at a ridiculously low price. It certainly is not right to put the honest laboring man's wages at a price he cannot work for and keep his family, just because other men are so mean they have to be sent to prison and then are hired out by the men we have sent there to represent us at a small wage and we are compelled to pay for keeping them. No, it is not right. Put them on the roads to work for us then we all get some of the benefit of their labor.

Usual low-priced colonist rates to the Pacific Northwest from the East will be in effect from March 10 to April 10 and will, no doubt, result in inducing many settlers to come West. Rates will be the same as last year, on the basis of \$25 to the Coast from Missouri River terminals. Fare from other points is in proportion, for example, \$33 from Chicago; \$32 from St. Louis; \$50 from New York City; \$49.75 from Washington, etc.

The double tracking of the O-W, R. & N. line down the Columbia River from Echo to Portland, as authorized this week by the Harrison directors in New York, will be of great benefit to the whole state. Improved transportation facilities will be provided, but, perhaps best of all, is the confidence shown in the Northwest by the great railway system in authorizing this heavy investment.

The Oregonian's fiftieth anniversary edition issued February 4th contained over 1200 pages. It is an edition valuable if kept for its historical worth. It contains much information as to the development of the Pacific Coast country, as the development of the Daily Oregonian in its fifty years was in keeping with the country's development.
