

GOOD USE FOR WASTE MILK

Skimmed Article Mixed With Phos phate of Lime Produces a Most Efficient Phosphate.

A new and exceedingly profitable

use has been discovered for the waste milk produced in such abundance by all creameries. There are sections of the country where this waste is used by the farmers who sell their cream to fatten pigs, but then again, there are districts where the milk, thoroughly skimmed and watery in character, is allowed to drain away. has been found, however, that by mixing the milk with phosphate of lime a most efficient phosphate is produced. The phosphate of lime is placed in a hollow heap on the floor, the waste milk is run into the hollow, and handful of yeast is added. In course of time the whole is turned and thoroughly mixed after the fashion mortar. After it has dried and is broken up it is a most efficient fertilizer, containing about 72.30 per cent, of phosphate and a little more than 1 per cent, of nitrogen. Unlike the manufacture of most phosphates this process is not attended by any of the disagreeable smells and other nuisances so closely associated with the ordinary fertilizer factory.


