GOOD USE FOR WASTE MILK

Skimmed Article Mixed With Phosphate of Lime Produces a Most Efficient Fertilizer.

A new and exceedingly profitable use has been discovered for the waste milk produced in such abundance by all creameries. There are sections of the country where this waste is used by the farmers who sell their cream to fatten pigs, but then again, there are districts where the milk, though skinned and watery in character, is allowed to drain away. It has been found, however, that by mixing the milk with phosphate of lime a most efficient fertilizer is produced.

The phosphate of lime is placed in a hollow heap on the floor, the waste milk is run into the hollow, and a handful of yeast is added. In course of time the whole is turned and thoroughly mixed after the fashion of mortar. After it has dried and is broken up it is a most efficient fertilizer, containing about 72.30 per cent. of phosphate and a little more than 1 per cent. of nitrogen. Unlike the manufacture of most phosphates, this process is not attended by any of the disagreeable smells and other nuisances so closely associated with the ordinary fertilizer factory.

SIX MEALS A DAY IN NORWAY.

Final Luncheon at 11 O'clock Fortifies Nature for Night.

"We came to know typical Norwegian households, with their wholesome, serene atmosphere," writes Caroline Thurber in a pleasant narrative of "A Motor Invasion of Norway," in the Century.

"Long evenings were spent among musicians, lovers of Greg, who interpreted his strange music for us as only Norwegians can. Current Events of Interest Gathered From the World at Large.

General Resume of Important Events Presented in Condensed Form for Our Busy Readers.

Municipal prisoners of Los Angeles have begun work on a municipal farm.

President Taft hopes for reciprocity with the republics of Central and South America.

A Mexican rebel general, carrying his rifle, crossed the border into Texas and was promptly jailed.

An all-metal aeroplane is being built in Boston, in which the aviator expects to cross the Atlantic ocean.

The provisional government of Portugal is surprised at the delay in its recognition by other governments.

A prominent Japanese count says the opening of the Panama canal will obliterate all hard feelings between the citizens of the Pacific coast and Japan.
