Estacada High School Wins Debate

Unanimous Decision Of Judges In Favor Of Estacada—
Championship Debate
At Parkplace

The Estacada High School and Mt. Pleasant 9th grade debating teams argued the question "Resolved: That Immigration should be further restricted by law" before a small audience at the High School building on Friday evening. The young debaters did very well

and afforded good entertainment to those present. The Estacada team, who had the affirmative side of the question put up such forceful arguments that the judges gave a unanimous decision in their favor. Rev. Browne, Dr. Wells of Portland and Principal Robinson of Gresham were appointed judges. Malcolm Woodie, Russel Betts and Kitty Ellen Reagan were the Estacada team and Maude Riley, David Thomas and Arthur King were the Mt. Pleasant debaters. Miss Riley in particular, of the visiting team, received special mention from all the spectators in her effort to sustain her side of the question. The Misses Myrtle and Mary Woodie rendered an instrumental duet and Rachael Reed a solo during the evenings entertainment. Principal Ceivers and Miss Stafford of the Mt. Pleasant school, Miss Francis of the Oregon City schools and Principal Robinson of the Gresham schools accompanied the visiting team.

Principal James of our school at the close of the debate complimented the visiting debaters on their team. This debate was to have taken place with Oregon City High School team a week before. Word was received stating that the Oregon City team could not come on account of some of their number being sick. Information came to Mr. James that the Oregon City team had gone to Parkplace and listened to the same question being debated. This would give them an advantage and Mr. James, for the local team, claimed the decision in favor of the Estacada team by default. This being two winnings for our home team it was announced they would debate with the Parkplace High School team for the championship of the county.
