A new alignment of good roads forces was made during the past week at a meeting in Portland when steps were taken to organize a statewide good roads association with county branches. The former Oregon Good Roads Association was dissolved, after all its affairs had been wound up. By means of the new organization it is expected to secure co-operation throughout Oregon to accomplish its objects. Sentiment for good roads legislation will be aroused.

The cutting of burned cedar poles has become quite an industry in Coos and Curry counties. Last year an experimental order was given for the burned over piling by the Santa Fe Railroad. The timber was found to be satisfactory and there is a big demand for it. There are large quantities of burned cedar in the forests of the Coast counties and it has been found still serviceable even 40 years after the trees were killed by fire.

May 1, always a notable date in Northwest history, was observed this year with appropriate exercises at Champoc, upon the historic ground where 68 years ago the foundations of civil government on the Pacific Coast were laid. The Oregon Pioneer Association and the Native Sons of Oregon had charge of the observance of the anniversary.

The Oregon Mining Congress, that meets in Portland May 16-18, will bring together a large number of men interested in this industry. Many parts of the West will be represented. It is intended to arouse greater interest in mining, an activity that has been neglected to a considerable extent in this state.

Great Booster Campaign Is Planned
Plan is to Raise One Thousand Dollars to be Used to Secure Booklet Descriptive of This Country

Money To Be Raised
By May 15th

Committees to try and Raise Necessary Money Are Busy at Work

On Friday evening last, a meeting was held at the City Hall to consider means of starting a progressive booster campaign for Estacada and vicinity.

The meeting was called on short notice, nevertheless there was a good enthusiastic gathering, representative of the Estacada Fruit Growers' Association and the Estacada Commercial Club.

The main object of the meeting was to consider the raising of funds for an immediate advertising campaign, for the up-to-date advertising of Estacada and its wonderful fruit and farming country.

It was decided to raise a sum of not less than \$1000, said sum to be used in defraying the expense of having printed a first class booklet, illustrative of this country.

As soon as the \$1000 is assured, a committee, made up from the two local associations, will immediately get up and have printed from 20,000 to 30,000 booklets.

This booklet is to be first class in every particular. It will contain several dozen good photographic reproductions, including views of the town, its buildings and immediate surroundings, views of farm and fruit lands on all sides, orchards, homes, etc. It is aimed to make this booklet a truthful statement of actual conditions in and about here showing our advantages and opportunities, without any exaggeration or fictitious portrayal.

This booklet will be for general distribution and all contributors will be entitled to such number as they may need, to send out to their friends, relatives and others interested. The committee has also arranged to have a liberal number distributed through the agency of the Portland Chamber of Commerce and other equally as effective mediums.

There lies in no ones mind the doubt of Estacada's need of such advertising and especially such a town and country as we have here. Nearly every town and rural section of Oregon and the Northwest have some good illustrated advertising matter, excepting our town of Estacada.

The business men and others in Estacada are in receipt of at least a dozen letters per week, asking for descriptive matter about Estacada and our fruit land and there is now on file over 200 unanswered letters from parties asking for such information, but to date we have no way of answering them. So there is no doubt of the necessity of this section advertising itself.

Estacada has more to offer than 90% of the localities in the West, but to date we haven't been offering same or letting anyone get wise to the facts. We ourselves know that we have a wonderful country here, with its fine natural advantages for fruit raising and farming and for business and manufacturing locations, but to date we haven't advertised the fact to the outside world.
