Hope of Japan at Coronation.

There will be no more interesting royal guest at the coronation than the crown prince of Japan, who it is now definitely decided, will represent the mikado on that historic occasion. One of his characteristics is a fondness for wrestling, apropos of which it is related that during his school days he suffered the indignity of being beaten, in the presence of his father, by a powerful schoolmate. People expected the emperor to be displeased, but, on the contrary, he called the victor to him and heartily congratulated him.
"My son," said the mikado, "will one day need many such men as you."

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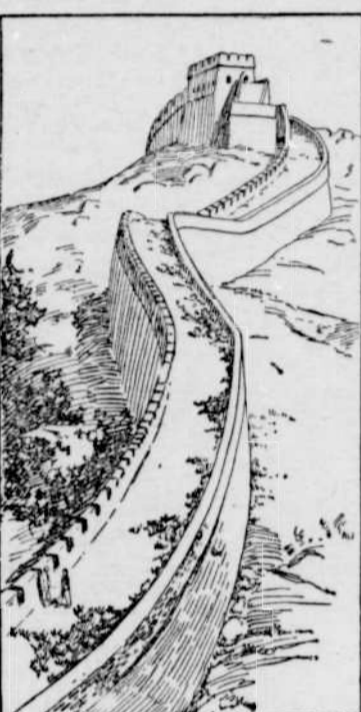
CHINA'S GREAT WALL

Wonder of World Is Literally Wall of Blood.

For Twenty-One Centuries It Has Remained the Most Amazing Construction of Human Hands—Builder's Name Cursed.

Pekin—Best known by repute of all the wonders of the world, the great wall of China has remained for 21 centuries the most amazing construction of human hands. Ruined and broken as it is, it is clear at first sight that the amount of human labor required to build this majestic barrier is without parallel on earth. Fifteen hundred miles long, with additional loops that add another 1,000 miles, there were originally 25,000 watch towers upon it.

The wall was built at the end of the third century before Christ by the first, and perhaps the greatest, of all Chinese emperors. Che-Hwang-te, prince of Tsin, succeeded as a boy to the throne of a comparatively small kingdom and at once began to put into a state of order and defense a territory that long had been allowed to degenerate into a mere prey to annual northern invaders. After a few years the young king assumed the style of emperor and organized the forces of what for the first time in history was China. For he at once gave to the whole of this new empire the name of his own small state. He then marched out against the Tartars, his hereditary and perennial enemies in the north. After routing these marauding pests he was recalled for the usual oriental need of

crushing out the seeds of rebellion at home. It was probably in order that he should not again find himself thus between two enemies that he conceived the gigantic defense of which the larger part remains to this day.
Undertaken by the magnitude of the task and the terrible loss of life that its construction must involve, Che-Hwang-te gave the word and the huge structure slowly forged its way from many centers at once along the entire northern boundary of what was then the Chinese empire. Che-Hwang-te enlisted the workers in many ways and from many quarters. Some of his press gang work was hardly creditable, for it is on record that the mere possession of a book condemned the wretched owner to four years' hard labor on the wall.
But as the Chinese proverb has it: "The annihilation of one generation has proved the salvation of others," and for many centuries the great wall served its purpose well.

Disappointment generally awaits the mortal who has heard much about some celebrated project and does visit it; so seldom does the reality come up to expectation. But the great wall is not overrated. Behold it by starlight or moonlight, gaze on it in twilight or in sunlight; view it through the haze of a dust fog, or the spindrift of a rain shower, or between the flakes of a snowstorm, ever is the wall one great, gray, gaunt, still specter of the past, creating the mountain peak or reposing in the shady valley. So vast is it that perhaps alone of all man's handiwork it could be discerned from the moon. So vast is it that were its materials disposed around the earth at the equator they would provide a wall eight feet high and three feet thick.

When we reflect on the labor needed to erect it we slowly divine the toll exacted from countless thousands, the sweat and tears and blood that must have been shed and we are prepared to hear that after two millennia the name of Che is cursed all along the wall by the descendants of those who were driven to the hateful task, who labored in deathly fear lest when flesh and blood failed to respond to the taskmaster's scourge, flesh and blood should be hurled into the mass of concrete to provide more material for the all-devouring monster. It is a wall of blood!

Decalogue is Platform.
Washington, May 11.—The decalogue and the golden rule as standards for laws and government are recommended to congress in a joint resolution prepared today by Representative Pepper, of Iowa, at the request of the Christian party. In the preamble to the resolution the Christian party expresses its belief in rightful ground and income taxes, its disapproval of a standing army and expense in further preparation for war and urges the suppression of saloons. The resolution went to the committee on rules.

Troops in Texas Moved.
San Antonio, Tex., May 15.—Important military maneuvers in the United States army began today when three infantry divisions, three companies of the engineering corps, the signal corps and the sanitary contingent left Fort Sam Houston for the Leon Springs military reservation. Tomorrow the artillery and cavalry brigades will follow. The troops will remain a week. Meanwhile military problems will be worked out.

Desertions in Texas Few.
Washington, D. C.—Published reports of wholesale desertions of American troops in Texas to the Madero forces across the line received a quietus when Adjutant General Ainsworth made public figures showing that there were only 37 desertions from all the troops on the border, and in San Antonio and Galveston during the first 12 days of May, and 120 during the entire two months of March and April.

REBELS IN MUTINY

Demand Execution of Navarro and Threaten Life of Leader.

Madero Defies Mutineers and Dares Them to Shoot—Affair Thought Government Scheme.

Juarez, Mex., May 15.—The supreme test, the clash between the military and political authorities, was experienced by the provisional government of Mexico today and Provisional President Francisco I. Madero tonight is complete master of the situation.
After a day of many exciting incidents, during which the lives of Madero and his chiefs were in danger, General Orozco, in a moment of passion, ordered the arrest of the little rebel leader and demanded the resignation of the provisional cabinet, the capital of the provisional government is quiet.

General Navarro, the defeated Federal commander, whose life was threatened early today, by angry mobs of insurgents, was spirited away by Madero himself to the American side of the Rio Grande and tonight is safely ensconced in the home of friends in El Paso.
A plot deeply laid is suspected by the rebel leaders as the cause of the near-trip in front of the Madero headquarters today, and some Maderists freely venture the opinion that it was a sinister scheme on the part of those who are trying to break up the organization of the revolution to foster the opinion throughout Mexico that the movement is one of banditry and anarchy. Madero, in a statement issued tonight, charged that General Orozco's actions were incited "by persons interested in bringing about disunion among us."

Early today General Orozco called on Madero and the two men talked alone for some time. Suddenly their voices were raised and the other rebel political chiefs rushed into the room only to find themselves held back by some of Orozco's men. A throng of soldiers had gathered outside the building and Madero determined to appeal to them. Six-shooters had been drawn and rifles leveled, but Madero stood bravely before the crowd and, slapping his breast, shouted: "Shoot me, shoot me, if you dare."
General Orozco was at his side. His men ostensibly had been summoned to take part in the coup d'etat, but, as Madero stepped forth among them and talked in his calm, reassuring way, the affection which has been ripening among his men since the revolution began, crystallized in a mighty shout: "Viva Madero."

There are all sorts of stories about the clash, but at the bottom it is apparent that dissensions among the military chiefs was the basic cause of the disturbance. Colonel Villa was said to have insisted on General Navarro's life, while General Orozco was said to have been displeased with the naming of a civilian as minister of war. Tonight all is harmony and Madero has impressed upon General Orozco that the choosing of a cabinet and the management of a government is quite outside the functions of the military.

Apprehension for the safety of General Navarro stirred General Madero after the incident at the municipal building and he determined, at the risk of his own life, to save the brave Federal commander. He was whisked away in an automobile to where General Navarro has been staying since he was captured and for a brief respite, conveyed Navarro to the river front, where the latter waded the river and soon was safe on American territory.
American troops were ready to protect him, if necessary, but the insurgents were completely ignorant of Madero's move until it was accomplished.

War on Fleas.
It is estimated that 10,000,000 fleas are spent annually for fly screens, while the wholesome out-of-doors is left to the enemy. In addition, there are expensive and disagreeable poisons, sticky paper and other devices for killing off the pest. Dr. Clifton F. Hodge, professor of biology at Clark University, will endeavor to make Worcester, Mass., "a flealess city." He has a practical plan to get rid of house flies, which spread typhoid fever and other diseases. He proposes to educate the people to co-operate with him and will start on his campaign of prevention as soon as flies begin to appear in the spring. Students will assist him and be assigned to different fields. One will be assigned to a dairy, another to a barn and every breeding place of the insect pest will be under surveillance.
