Rev. Browne gave a very interesting school talk before the Estacada High School on the customs at Rugby and the English public schools.

All this week a special train will be run from Portland leaving there 11:33 p. m. for the accommodation of the Rose Festival visitors. A special day rate of 75 cents for the round trip exists all week.

Portland will have a commission form of government as soon as the required changes can be brought about. Mayor Simon has named a commission to draft a charter providing for the new form and the recent city election will only hasten the change, as all candidates were favorable to it.

Oregon threshermen held a successful convention in Portland during the past week, there being a good attendance from all parts of the state. Good roads was quite naturally a subject in which much interest was shown and other angles of the threshermen's business, were considered.

Getting Ready For The Fourth

The Fourth of July, as previously announced, will be fittingly celebrated in this city and the numerous committees who are responsible for the success of the adventure are busy preparing to make it a day long to be remembered. The day will include races of all kinds, orations by noted speakers and 3 baseball games. River Mill plays Garfield and Estacada plays the winner. The "Fats" and "Leans," made up of "has-beens" play later in the evening. It promises to be a mirth-provoking wind-up for the baseball games. Dancing will be indulged in by the lovers of that pleasure in the Pavilion, both afternoon and evening and, altogether, the day will be turned over to sport and pleasure. On the night of July 1st the Fire Department will give a dance in the Pavilion and during its progress the votes will be counted each half hour and the correct list tallied. Promptly at the stroke of 12 the voting will cease and the Goddess of Liberty for 1911 will then be declared elected.

Several new features will probably be introduced by the committee on sports, as they desire to have something doing all the time.

Mercantile Sells

A business sale of importance to Estacada was consummated last Thursday when the Estacada Mercantile Co. sold to J. S. and J. R. McCurdy their implement, vehicle, harness, sash and door and paints. This business the Mercantile company had recently placed together in the old Cary Hardware Co. room and offered it for sale as they were unable to give it the attention they considered it ought to receive. The McCurdy's, father and son, come from Missouri and Kansas, where each has been in business. J. S. McCurdy being for twenty-five years connected with a big implement company as traveling salesman and J. R. McCurdy in the retail lumber business in Stafford and Dodge City, Kansas.

The style of the new firm will be The McCurdy Lumber & Hardware Co. They have leased the Cary Hardware room for a year. It is the intention of the new firm to add a lumber yard and a full line of hardware to the business. The two men only are here at present, but as each have families they will come in a short time, when they expect to build homes for themselves.

Carbolic acid emulsion is used to destroy the eggs and young maggots which infest radishes, onions and similar garden crops, and occasionally for other insects, is a statement of H. F. Wilson, entomologist at the Oregon Agricultural College, who is about to publish a useful bulletin on the protection of the garden from pests.

To make such an emulsion, dissolve a pound of hard soap in a gallon of boiling water, add a pint of crude carbolic acid, and churn (preferably with a hand pump) until the mixture is a creamy white. This forms a stock which may be diluted by adding thirty times as much water as stock. It should be applied to the surface of the ground about the plants.
