JOHNSON HOME AS MUSEUM

Gloomy Place Where Famous Dictionary Was Compiled to Become National Property.

London.—Dr. Johnson's gloomy eighteenth century house in Gough square is to become national property as a Johnsonian museum. The building, which is now marked by a tablet placed there by the Society of Arts, is the most noteworthy of all Johnson's London residences. The "stout old-fashioned oak balustraded house," as Carlyle found it eighty years ago, will need some restoring; for its foundations have been shaken by the printing machinery only recently taken out of the basement. It has a typical paneled door

of the period, with carved lintel. Its walls are of red brick, and the high pitched roof, pierced by windows, has twin gables overshadowed by a tall chimney stack. Here Johnson spent the busiest decade of his life, and here his dictionary was begun and finished.

He had an upper room fitted like a counting house, and here his copyists wrote out the illustrative passages from the various authorities, which Johnson himself had marked with lead pencil. At times, but not often, he walked in the garden, "a plot of leveled ground no longer than a bed quilt."

But the house has other associations than that of the dictionary. Johnson here began both the "Rambler" and the "Idler," and here he was living when his tragedy of "Irene" was produced by Garrick. Here also his wife died. In 1755, when Johnson had been in Gough square seven years, the great dictionary was published.

SKULL WAS TRANSPARENT

Strange Conditions Free Man From Murder Charge in Philadelphia Court—Brain Was Normal.

Philadelphia.—If it hadn't been for the discovery that Joseph C. Quinn had a skull as fragile as an egg shell, Peter Fox, Jr., might have been held by Coroner Ford for inflicting the injuries which caused Quinn's death.

When the coroner learned Quinn's skull was so thin that large print could be read through it when it was held to the light he discharged Fox on the ground that Quinn's death was traceable to the abnormality.

Quinn was muscular and athletic. He went to a poolroom at Island road and Woodlawn avenue and made a disturbance. Fox, the proprietor, tried to quiet him. As Quinn became increasingly ugly Fox struck him. It was a blow that would have done little or no harm to an ordinary man, but Quinn dropped to the floor.

Doctor Wadsworth, who performed the autopsy, testified Quinn's skull would bend under the pressure of his fingers. The man's brain, he added, was normal.

OLD CHURCH AT ANTIETAM

Most Severe Fighting in Famous Battle Occurred in Vicinity of This Edifice.

Sharpsburg, Md.—The church shown in the illustration is located one mile from this place, on the famous Antietam battlefield. It was built by the German Baptists in 1853. Some of the most severe fighting of the battle of Antietam occurred near

here and after the battle the church was used as a hospital and embalming station. During the battle the Bible was taken by a New York soldier and after an absence of 41 years was returned and is now occupying its old place on the pulpit.

\$170,000,000 Lost in Babies.

Boston.—More than 10,000 babies under one year of age die each year in Massachusetts, representing an economic loss of \$170,000,000, and at least 10 per cent. of these deaths are caused by unclean milk, declared former Representative Myron Pierce, legislative counsel for the Massachusetts Milk Consumers' association. He added that more than 2,000 lives could be saved by a system of prevention costing only \$50,000 a year.

Stage Name Not Valid.

Berlin.—Emmy Destinn, the famous opera singer, has successfully pleaded in the supreme court here that a bill of exchange for \$500 she borrowed from a Prague tailor in 1908 was valid because she signed it with her stage name, Destinn, instead of her real name, Kittel.

SCORES BIG TRUSTS

Taft Says Lumber and Paper Combinations Oppose Reciprocity.

Confident Agreement Will Pass and Prove Beneficial—Thinks People Approve Measure.

Chicago.—President Taft, in a speech before the Western Economic society, here, declared that the principal opposition to the Canadian reciprocity agreement came not from the farmer, but from the lumber trust and from American manufacturers of print paper.

In one of the most conspicuous addresses that he has ever made on this subject, the president outlined some of the methods employed by the advocates of the reciprocity agreement; he practically told others that they were being "buncoed" by special interests, and said that the result depended not so much upon the United States senate as upon the people.

"If the farmer and the people at large," he said, "could be brought to understand this question they would no longer fear to vote."

The president was not sparing in his words. He told the reasons for the opposition to the treaty by the lumber trust, the paper manufacturers and, without using names, scored any firm of whose members recently appeared before the senate finance committee in Washington ostensibly on behalf of the national grange.

In spite of the forces that are arrayed against it, the president expressed the belief that the bill will be passed. "The bill," he said, "will be passed, if it is passed at all, because the force of public opinion is in its favor."

FLY IS DEATH TO BEETLE.

Parasite that Will Kill Douglas Fir Enemy Is Discovered.

Seattle, Wash.—The bark beetle, which destroys Douglas fir throughout the timbered districts of the United States to the extent of almost \$100,000,000 annually, and which was believed by expert entomologists to be without a parasite, has been found to have a deadly enemy. Professor Trevor Kincaid, head of the department of zoology at the University of Washington, is the discoverer. The parasite is a small red fly with smoky wings and a long stinger-like organ behind. The parasite instinctively discovers the beetle and lays its eggs in the beetle's tunnel.

Professor Kincaid says the newly discovered parasite will destroy from 25 to 50 per cent of a colony of beetles in one season. The discovery was made in Ravenna park, in Seattle, while Professor Kincaid was out in the woods with one of his classes.

Professor Kincaid attained prominence by his discovery of a parasite on the grape moth, which was destroying millions of dollars' worth of fruit trees annually.

SWEDEN WELCOMES FLEET.

American Warships Escorted to Stockholm By Pleasure Craft.

Stockholm, June 5.—The second division of the United States Atlantic fleet, composed of the battleships Kansas, Louisiana, New Hampshire and South Carolina, arrived here today for a week's visit. The battleships, which left Copenhagen June 1, were met off the Aland archipelago by a large fleet of gaily-decorated excursion boats, which escorted them into the harbor.

Immediately after the flagship Louisiana came to anchor the commander of the fortress sent an officer to greet and welcome Rear Admiral Badger, commanding the division. Visits were then exchanged between Admiral Badger and the commander in chief of the Swedish squadron in the harbor.

Woman Has Saving Mania.
Worcester, Mass.—Relatives of Miss Margaret Hudon, who died here recently after working as a shop clerk for 17 years at \$1 a day, have found bank deposits in her name aggregating \$5,200. Her total earnings had been about \$9,304 and from this she paid her living expenses for the whole 17 years and the cost of the funeral of her brother, who died three years ago. Miss Hudon is said to have lived on 30 cents' worth of food each week. Her house rent was very small. She had a mania for saving.

Girls Astride Under Ban.
Nashville, Tenn.—Because several girls were mounted astride in the recent parade at the Little Rock reunion, the local bivariate of Confederate veterans adopted this resolution: "That no woman shall appear in the parades of the camps, the state divisions, or the general associations astraddle, and should any so appear, the officers in charge of said parade shall politely request that they retire." The resolution requested generals not to appoint young women as staff officers.

Civil War Battle Remembered.
Phillipi, W. Va.—Fifty years ago the first land battle of the Civil war was fought at Phillippi and this was the semi-annual centennial anniversary of the event. Union and Confederate veterans went over the line of retreat of the Southern troops when they were driven out of Phillippi. Addresses were made by Governor Glasscock, United States Senator Taylor, of Tennessee, ex-Senator Henry G. Davis and Colonel John T. McGraw.
