Report Of Small Fruit Committee

Interesting Account of Marketing of Small Fruit as Told by Fruit Committee

I've been asked to give a brief report on what has been accomolished by the committee on narketing small fruits for the association. The committee which is composed of Mr. Trapp, Mr. Reagan and myself were appointed some two months ago and were given full power to perfect a plan for the disposition of strawberries and other small fruits. We first investigated the proposition of packing the strawberries as they do at Hood River but we find this is not feasible on account of the tenderness of our ripe berries so we abandoned this idea.

Another scheme that we thought night work out was the direct sellng of our fruit to the retail groceries of Portland. Mr. Snuffin who has had a great deal of experience along these lines was asked to help out and he and I spent two days in Portland calling on the grocery stores and succeeding in taking orders for about 1500 crates. I don't think we would have any trouble disposing of our entire crop this way but we found after a great deal of investigation that we were hardly in shape this year to attempt such a plan as it would necessitate keeping a man at Portland to attend to the orders and then too the retail trade are very uncertain people to deal with, so we decided to pick out a good reliable commis-

sion house and consign to them. 
