### CALL A MASS MEETING

County Division Data Ready  
For Public Saturday.

### TO MEET AT BONER'S THEATRE

Discussion Opens at 2 O'Clock by Assigned Speakers—Oregon City Delegation Here Wednesday Next.

To those residents of East Clackamas county who are undecided as to the stand they will take on the subject of division, an opportunity to learn facts and figures in support of the position, will be afforded at the mass meeting called for next Saturday afternoon, April 13, at 2 o'clock at Boner's theatre.

The executive committee of the campaign has got together data which will prove interesting to the Eastern section. Charts will show the area, assessable valuation, population, etc. and a big map with the line of the proposed division.

The committee urges everybody to turn out for this meeting. The Oregon City delegates will be here Wednesday night, April 17, and the committee wants to be in shape to present the sentiment. A delegate from every precinct in East Clackamas will attend the dinner to be given the Oregon City people and some decision reached as to West Clackamas' attitude.

### Standish Takes Furbeck As Real Estate Partner

R. M. Standish and R. J. Furbeck, the latter of Portland, looked over the Springwater country the first part of the week. The two have formed a real estate partnership. Mr. Furbeck will conduct the Portland office in the Lumberman's Exchange building; Mr. Standish, the Estacada office.

The formation of this firm gives the Estacada country good representation at both ends of the line. Both members are hustlers and will devote their time exclusively to this section, which is more than may be said of a number of Portland realty men who list property from here along with holdings of various other sections. Robert A. Duncan, senior member of the firm of Duncan & Cruse Brothers, has sold his interest in the store, corner of Main and Second streets, to E. F. and H. M. Cruse

who will conduct the business under the name of Cruse Brothers.

Mr. Duncan has a legion of friends in the Estacada country but his business interests in Portland, where he is a partner in a printing establishment, made it necessary for him to sell here.

Cruse Brothers, E. F. and "Heine" are among the well known young business men of the town—hustlers, enterprising, and boosters for Estacada. The store is being improved and will be conducted along its past modern lines.

### Voted for Fremont and Lincoln; now for Taft

### ELECT MILLS ALDERMAN

Council Chooses Him Over  
Three Other Candidates.

### GET A WINDFALL OF \$1,000

Back Taxes for two Years Turned in by County—Pool Room Licenses are Reduced to \$15 a Quarter.

J. S. Osborne, resigned alderman, took a peek at the city council Tuesday night and withdrew before they elected his successor A. J. Mills, who is employed at River Mill. Osborne presented the suggestion that he was back to see whether he could be re-elected.

"Never again!" he declared emphatically.

So this is the way the council went about nominating a successor:

Underwood nominated E. S. Womer; Jones named B. R. Kimmel; Hawkins put up A. J. Mills and Lindsey nominated Willis Cox. Each Alderman explained he had been at some trouble to get his candidate to take a chance.

The first ballot, which was decisive resulted as follows: Womer 1; Kimmel 1; Mills 3; Cox, 0. Mayor Reed voted, making a total of five votes cast. Mills was declared elected. None of the candidates were present.

### Treasury is Replenished.

City Recorder Devore reported that the county had turned into the city on the road fund, something over \$1,000 for back taxes of 1909-1910. This was about \$500 more than the council expected.

Mayor Reed said one of the pool rooms wanted a reduction in licenses. On motion of Jones it was reduced from \$25 a quarter to \$15, up to October 1.

Bills of \$596.52 were allowed, of which amount \$458.72 were taken from the water fund for Terrace addition water main, the remainder for miscellaneous bills.

Easement over the P. R. L. & P. property for the city sewer was accepted. An amendment to the ordinance eliminating license on steam wood saws was placed on its first reading. Jones gave notice that he would present an ordinance against traction engines.
