Crew Faces Death on Barren Isle for Eleven Days - Last Chance Wins by Three Hours.

Seattle, Wash.-Bringing Captain on Chirikoff Island April 21, the steamship Bertha, of the Alaska Coast company, has arrived in Seattle.

Giving a graphic description of the terrific storm which resulted in the loss of the schooner and the death of John Jorgensen, the vessel's first mate, members of the crew of the Russ declared that only for the hero-ism of A. E. Reeves (Scotty), second mate, and five sailors who went to Chignik in two open boats for assistance, all would have perished.

In a terrific gale, with heavy seas breaking over her, the Russ was driven ashore at 6 o'clock in the evening. Grounding on the sand she held her own for several hours, but finally, as the heavy seas continued to pound her, the vessel's hatches gave way and she quickly filled with water. 


