MRS. MILLER IN COUNCIL

Is Elected to Serve Term of Lindsey, Resigned

STATE'S FIRST ALDERMANESS

Accepts Position and Will Serve in the Council until June—Formerly Opposed to Equal Suffrage

Mrs. Myrtle Miller, wife of E. M. Miller, was elected as a member of the council at a meeting of that body Tuesday night, to serve the unexpired term of Alderman Lindsey retired.

Without a doubt Mrs. Miller is the first woman in the state of Oregon to be chosen to such a position, since equal suffrage carried. She has accepted and will serve out Lindsey's term which expires next June.

The meeting of the council was brief. After allowing the bill for street lighting, Alderman Hawkins nominated Mrs. Miller to take Lindsey's place. Mayor Reed put the motion and she was declared elected.

Formerly opposed Suffrage

Mrs. Miller said she had been doubtful as to the wisdom of women entering the political arena but now that they have been given the ballot she believed they should assume the burdens and responsibilities of government.

"I don't know much about running a city," she added, "but I can learn. I will do my best to serve the city's interests and believe the experience will be worth while."

Mrs. Miller is prominent in the Rebekah lodge and is past noble grand and has been delegate several times to the grand lodge. At present she is a member of Acme lodge of Portland. She is the mother of three children.

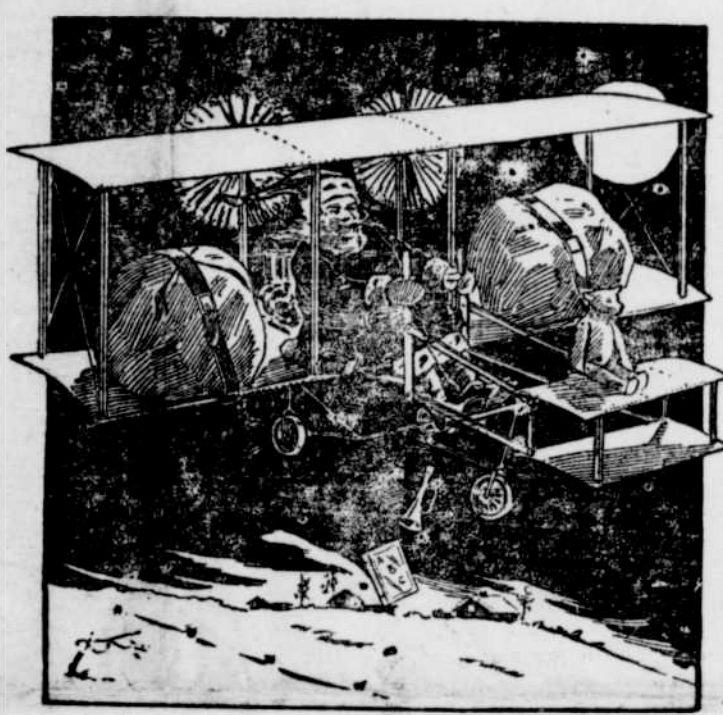
