It was shortly after 4 o'clock when the president, after making a short speech here, boarded one of the launches of the Arkansas, together with Mrs. Taft and the remainder of the presidential party, and was taken to the battleships. A few minutes later both the Arkansas and the Delaware, which will act as an escort, had weighed anchor and were steaming out of the harbor.

The presidential party will spend three days in the canal region. President Taft plans to get back to Key West on December 29, and two days later to be in Washington.






