Admiral of American Forces Orders

Halt in Mexican Affair.

Foreigners at Tampico Ordered to Congregate at Shore-Rebels Repairing Railroads.

Mexico City.—Rear Admiral Fletcher, commander of the American naval force in Mexican waters, Saturday ordered the rebels and federals fighting at Tampico to cease firing, threatening to open up on them with the guns of the gunboat Wheeling if his orders were not obeyed. The order was complied with.

This information is contained in a dispatch received by Sir Lionel Carden, the British ambassador, from Rear Admiral Sir Christopher Craddock, of the British cruiser Berwick, which is lying off Tampico.

The federals hold the center of the

town of Tampico and the water front. Rear Admiral Fletcher ordered foreigners to take refuge on board ships or to congregate on the water front, where they would be under the protection of his guns.
