# VILLA GETS OJINAGA

Entire Federal Garrison, With 1500 Civilians, Flees Across Line.

ance Is Made to Final Blow Refugees in Bad Plight.

Presidio, Tex.-The Mexican federal army with its nine generals, evac-uated Ojinaga, Mex., at 10 o'clock Sat-urday night. The triumphant rebel forces under General Francisco Villa immediately occupied the village.

The defeat of the federal army followed only a few hours' fighting in which the rebels, beginning at sun-down, started to close in on the besieged garrison with a terrific fire of cannon, shrapnel and rifles.

General Castro and Generaal Mer-cado, of the federal regulars, saw that the assault was to be nothing less than a massacre. The federals had left only 50 rounds of ammunition for each man. General Castro and Mercado therefore gave the order to evacuate. All the federal soldiers and their officers who could scramble to the American side did so. The others ran in all directions.

General Pascual Orozco, commander of federal volunteers, threatened with summary execution by Villa, was the first to cross. It was believed he es-

caped into the mountains of Texas.

Salazar and Orozco are being watched for in the United States on indictments charging them with violating the neutrality laws. General Landa said he was cortain all the federal generals escaped.


