Farmer's Week Recipes

(Continued from page four)

APPLE DUMPLING, Large Recipe—Nine cups of flour, one tablespoon of salt, three tablespoons of baking powder, one and one-half cups of lard, three-fourths cup of butter, one and one-half cups of milk, one and one-half cups of sugar, rub into a paste six tablespoons of butter, and one and one-half cups of sugar. Proceed as for the small recipe.

DOUGH NUTS—Four tablespoons of sugar, one-half cup of milk, one tablespoon of lard, one-half egg, one teaspoon of baking powder, speck of salt, flour enough to make a soft dough to roll out, into shape and fry in deep fat.

HOLLANDAISE SAUCE—One-half cup of butter, three egg yolks, one tablespoon of lemon juice, dash of cayenne, three tablespoons of boiling water.

TARTAR SAUCE—One-half teaspoon of mustard, one teaspoon of powdered sugar, one-half teaspoon of salt, dash of cayenne, two egg yolks, one-half cup of olive oil, one and one-half tablespoons of vinegar, make this the same as you would if making mayonnaise dressing and just before serving, add one and one-half tablespoons each of finely chopped capers, pickles, olives and parsley.
