APPLE DUMPLING, Large Recipe-Nine cups of floor, one table-spoon of salt, three tablespoons of baking powder, one and one-half cups of lard, three-fourths cup of butter, one and one-half cups of milk, one and one-balf cups of sugar, rub into a paste six tablespoons of batter, and one and one-half cups of sugar. Proceed as for the small recipe.

DOUGH NUTS-Four tablespoons of sugar. one half cup of milk, one tablespoon of lard, onehalf egg, one teaspoon of baking powder, speck of salt, flour enough to make a soft dough to roll out,

HOLLANDAISE SAUCE -- Onehalf cup of butter, three egg yolks, one tablespoon of lemon juice, dash of cavenne, three tablespoons of boiling water,
