### County Buys Crusher

Road supervisor, Chas. Duncan of Garfield, last Monday unloaded the rock crusher at Estacada, which was recently purchased by the county from the P. R. L. & P. Co. This crusher has been located at River Mill and will be moved onto the Reagan hill as soon as the weather permits.

Inasmuch as the Reagan hill road is to have a large amount of work this season, the crusher will be located there temporarily. Supervisor Duncan also expects to rebuild or repair the worn spots on the Wilson hill road and other similar places in his district.

A suggestion was made some time ago about the advisability of the county purchasing the P. R. L. & P. Co.'s rock crusher and quarry above Cazadero and operating it for general county use. For the road districts near the railway lines, this crushed rock would be a benefit, but for those districts requiring an up hill haul from the railway, it would be of little use.
