New Industries

It takes the enterprising farmers of Estacada and surrounding country to pioneer along agricultural lines. Adolph Sagner of Estacada has an elaborate ginseng garden that is no small affair, comprising several hundred dollars worth of beds, with shades overhead and dozens of appurtenances peculiar to the growing of this medicinal root. While it takes a matter of about seven years for this product to yield a profit, it looks as though a few years more would find Sagner selling the roots by the hundred weight at \$7. per pound. Jerry Jones of Estacada also has gone into the growing of ginseng on an extensive scale.

The latest novel planting comprises one acre, which is to be planted to peppermint, by Mr. Twombly of Garfield. Last week he hauled a wagon load, comprising 24 sacks of these roots from Estacada, and the planting will be done at once. This product is used for the obtaining of essence of peppermint.

Lewellen Estate Probated

The estate of William J. Lewellen, the pioneer merchant of Springwater, was probated in the county court Thursday by Mrs. Martha Jane Lewellen, his widow. The estate is valued at \$10,000. Mr. Lewellen died in Portland, March 4th.

R. R. Cleaning Up

The P. R. L. & P. Co., have had several men busy for the past week, cleaning up their right of way through Estacada. They have raked up and burned all refuse and old ties. They have also built a level extension to the side walk leading from the hotel into the Park, doing away with the steps that have proven a stumbling spot in the past. Maybe the railroad people are doing this work as a gentle hint for the residents to get busy with their "clean up day."

Spraying For Currant And Gooseberry Worm

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, Mar. — There are two insect pests, which attack the currant and gooseberry. One occurs as a small white maggot inside the developing fruit causing it to ripen prematurely and drop to the ground. This pest is known as the currant maggot or the gooseberry fruit fly. The other pest is a velvety green worm which feeds on the leaves stripping the foliage from the bushes about the time the fruit is maturing. This pest is known as the native currant worm.

Sprays are not generally effective in controlling the currant maggot. Stir the soil thoroughly to some depth about the bushes in the fall and again in late March.

For the green currant worm spray the bushes with a lead arsenate solution using one ounce of lead arsenate to three gallons of water. This spray to do the most good must be applied just after the fruit is set on the bushes. If one does not apply this early spray, the worms may be killed when the fruit is large by a spray of white hellebore powder one ounce in three gallons of water. This material is non poisonous and does not discolor the fruit. The early spray is to be recommended, however.

SOME POULTRY WISDOM.

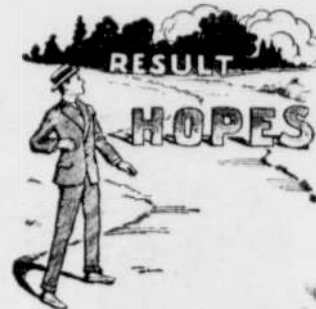
Get a bone cutter. Get a good one. The relation between the bone cutter and poultry success is very close, especially in the winter, when hens are apt to be penned up a large part of the time and when the family is consuming much meat. The green bones from the table and from the kitchen waste can thus be made into poultry flesh and be a source of profit.

One of the best if not the best animal food for poultry is milk. All the ingredients necessary to form a perfect animal food are found in skim milk. It makes no difference whether it is sweet or sour or how it is fed, whether alone or with other foods, it answers its purpose equally as well.

A windbreak of some sort makes a poultry house warmer on the inside and gives the fowls a sheltered place for outdoor exercise. The owner of a chicken house built under the shelter of a number of evergreen trees says drinking water hardly ever freezes inside.

To keep poultry from roosting over feed mangers and other places that ought to be kept clean nail a small wire four inches above the board.

This is a good time to figure up accounts for the year and see what the chicken business has done for us.
